2. Submit a paper on the value of furthering STEAM education for yourself and/or others and its importance in any career setting.
3. Generate a proposed layout for the future Project Fibonacci® STEAM campus. The Project Fibonacci® STEAM campus will be built on the Beeches Professional grounds. Colleges, universities, and local businesses will be involved on the campus as well as other STEAM related facilities. Design and produce your vision.
4. Create a presentation on the Fibonacci sequence and how it can be seen throughout the world. Include ties to STEAM related fields.
